
Arrival Inspection Checklist

A visual inspection should be made to confirm that the truck has remained in good condition during transit. Damage can occur during shipping. After delivery, the truck should be carefully checked for *hidden damage*. If any damage is found, the details should be noted on the delivery receipt *immediately*. Any such damage not noted on the delivery report should be reported, in writing, to the delivering carrier within 48 hours.

The following list may be helpful in checking the truck:

- Inspect the battery and charger in accordance with the manufacturer's installation instructions. If such instructions are not attached, contact your *Raymond Dealer* or the battery and charger distributor.
- Make sure wiring is in good condition and securely connected.
- Make sure all hydraulic lines are connected tightly. Excessive fluid may indicate a loose or broken fitting.
- Make sure hydraulic hoses and tubing are free of dents and/or buckles.
- Make sure all chains are unbroken and clear of obstructions.
- Make sure wheels turn smoothly. They should be free of chips and cracks.
- Examine the entire structure for damages, such as dents or cracks.
- Make sure the battery compartment gate(s) is securely in place.

Upon completion of the visual inspection, an operational test should be made.
